White Pt. Nature Preserve at Risk?

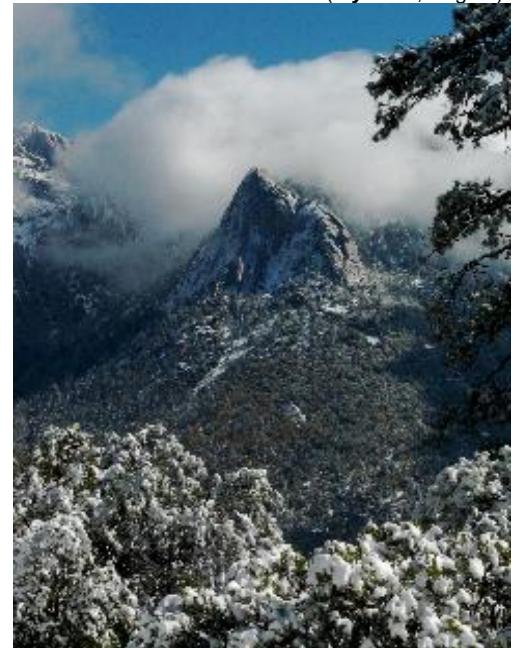
On November 20, a landslide took out a portion of Paseo del Mar, the road that runs adjacent to the White Point Nature Preserve in coastal San Pedro. Although the area has a history of slide activity, a geotechnical firm has begun soil testing to determine the cause of the landslide.
