We knew Marlene for taking our minutes and publicizing our events, which she faithfully did for many years.

We also knew her for her delicious homemade cookies that she brought to our monthly programs.

But it was during the tributes at Marlene's memorial service that we learned other details about the life of our friend.

She converted to Judaism and regularly participated in her Bible Study group.

She loved to read, and she especially enjoyed reading books on ancient civilizations. She was a member of a history study group and with that group had traveled to ancient sites in Egypt.

She was as an intense competitor of a variety of board games, among them Scrabble, and would challenge a competitor if the word used was not found in her dictionary.

Marlene told me that she liked to write, that she enjoyed composing the publicity notices for our program and sending them to the local newspapers.

As our group's secretary, she took the minutes each month, by hand - just pencil and paper - and then emailed them out.

"She was such a kind-hearted and vibrant soul, and she will be greatly missed," said her granddaughter, Sarai Plummer, in an email to our group.



At our holiday brunch, in this past December, she was cheerful, in good spirits. We were all happy to have her back with the group. It was her last visit with us. She passed on March 16th. She was 88.

Community Tree Mulching Day Brings Out Forty Volunteers

On February 19, 2022, the Crescenta Valley Group co-presented a Community Tree Mulching Day in Sunland, CA with TreePeople and 40 volunteers came out to help place mulch around 57 trees along a onemile section of Foothill Boulevard. The preparation for this event began the day before with a visit to L.A. Sanitation's Lopez Canyon site where four of our volunteers loaded up free mulch for the volunteers to use. Gail Adams of our CV Group used her own personal vehicle to load up mulch, which three other community volunteers used their trucks, including Leny Freeman, Cathy

& Randy Roberts, and Nelly Luboff & Matt Walker. The following morning, TreePeople's Xiomara Durán and four others representing TreePeople, set up a table in the parking lot at Ralph's supermarket in Sunland. Our four vehicles with the mulch then parked around it, and by 8:15 a.m. volunteers began arriving, including Roger Klemm of Rotary Club of Sunland-Tujunga with a 50-gallon rain barrel to wet down the finished mulch. In all, we had 30 adults and 10 children & teens help out, plus six organizers to get the job done in just under three hours.

Thank you's go to Lowe's of Pacoima, which donated 15 bags of Growmulch, 10 bags of Steer Manure, 4 tarps, and 20, 5-gallon buckets for our event; Ralph's manager, who provided us with access to water and parking; Gerardo Barrientos who handling the sign-ins and recordkeeping; Love the Neighborhood's Randy & Cathy Roberts who gave us tips on mulching and helped with this effort; and Sunland Tujunga Neighborhood Council members Nelly Luboff, Beautification Committee co-chair; and Safe Traffic & Transportation co-chair Jon von Gunten and member Leny Freeman, as well as Cheryl Schmidt, a board member who organized the children who volunteered.

Our Crescenta Valley Group donated \$100.00 for the purchase of supplies and with the organizational efforts of Program Chair Pat Kramer, we had another successful event in our community. Best of all, we did this at zero cost to the City of Los Angeles and without their help! It just goes to show what people can do when they work together to offset the damage from climate change and drought. We are now looking for community members who will "adopt" one or more of these trees by watering them, keep an eye on how they are doing, and remove any trash around them.
