"No Canyon Hills" Gaining Momentum

The Sierra Club and in particular the Crescenta Valley Group support the efforts of the No Canyon Hill organization. Here are some developments described in detail on the website: <u>https://nocanyonhills.org</u> Researchers and others working with the No Canyon Hills team state the 'Canyon Hills' Project site supports a vibrant ecosystem. In addition to coyote and bobcat, notable mammal species active in the site include Merriam's chipmunk, American black bear, and western gray squirrel, which have become rare at lowland elevations in Southern California. Three of our most significant findings at the Project site include mountain lion, Crotch's bumble bee, and the presence of various migratory birds.

On June 19, Senator Anthony J. Portantino and Senator Caroline Menjivar issued a formal letter to L.A. Department of Planning echoing NCH's call for a Subsequent EIR for 'Canyon Hills'. This is a significant sign of support from Senate members who state that the original EIR is "utterly obsolete and in desperate need of revision prior to final grading permits being authorized."

The Total Eclipse Viewing Adventure with Texas Sightseeing Tour: Join us for this 8 day 7 night sun and moon adventure with a tour of highlights of Texas. We will see the total eclipse of the sun in this rare appearance over the United States in 2024. The last one in the continental US happened in 2017 that we saw on our Wyoming trip.

We will be sightseeing and a little hiking in Texas. In Dallas, we plan to see the Dallas World Aquarium and the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Gardens. In Austin, we will do the state capital tour and visit the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center. In San Antonio, we will take a River Walk Cruise, visit the Alamo, the San Antonio Missions National Historical site, a UNESCO world heritage site, the San Fernando Cathedral and Spanish Governor's Palace. We also plan a brief stop to Brazos Bend State Park where we may see alligators, deer, and lots of different birds. The tour ends in Houston where we plan to visit the Houston Space Center and may do the Houston downtown underground city tour. We also plan to sample some of the famous Texas barbeque and ice cream. We will be seeing the Total Eclipse in a smaller Texas town that is on the centerline.

Join us for this 15 day, 14 night adventure in vibrant Morocco to experience the culture, nature, and beautiful sights of this exotic land. We will walk through the old narrow streets of Marrakech's Medina with it's vibrant market, a UNESCO world heritage site, gardens, mosques, and many other points of interest. We will visit the beautiful walled city of Essaouira whose Medina is another UNESCO world heritage site.

Next, we are off to Ait Ben Haddou to visit the kasbah, another UNESCO world heritage site, followed by a cultural experience with a local Moroccan family. We plan to drive on the Thousand Kasbah road visiting a few Kasbahs on our way to the Dades Gorge, where we can partake in a short nature hike (optional). We will travel to the Todra Gorge where you can go on another optional hike to explore the green oasis full of large date palms. We will follow up with a drive to the Moroccan desert and meet a Berber family.

We will head north to Azrou where we plan to hike in a cedar forest looking for Barbary Macques. We will go to the ancient city of Fez whose Medina is yet another UNESCO world heritage site!

We'll also visit the Roman Archaeological city of Volubilis (UNESCO world heritage site). We plan to spend a couple days exploring the mysterious blue city of Chefchaouen, Rabat, whose modern capital and historic city is a UNESCO world heritage site. We will conclude after a visit to Casablanca.
