On Saturday, February 19th, 2022, from 8:30 - 11 a.m., there will be a Sunland-Tujunga Community Tree Mulching event held with participation by the Crescenta Valley Group of the Sierra Club, Ralph's Market in Sunland, and Tree People. We will be mulching and watering about 60 trees along Foothill Boulevard in Sunland (between Ralphs and Vons). Anyone who wants to participate can also adopt the trees they mulch for future watering. Our event begins at 8:30 a.m. in the parking lot of the Ralphs Shopping Center (by the now closed Sizzler). We will be providing mulch and Ralphs will be providing water for your tree. There will be a training at 8:30 a.m. by Tree People ambassador Xiomara Duran on how to properly set the mulch around the

Regenerative Landscapes and Climate Adaptation" Webinar by Studio Petrichor

Shawn Maestretti, the principal of Studio Petrichor and the creator of the talk series, 'Regenerative Landscapes and the Climate Crisis' and Leigh Adams consultant, educator, eco-sensitive designer presented *Regenerative Landscapes and Climate Adaptation* in the latest joint webinar of the Verdugo Hills and Crescenta Valley, which took place January 24th, 2022. Hosted by David Eisenberg with cohost Pat Kramer. The program was educational and gave viewers valuable tips for transforming a yard into an eco-friendlier environment., attractive to wildlife and harmonizing with nature.

According to Shawn and Leigh, their landscape designs are created to meet the climate crisis, bringing solutions to the surface, and empowering communities to protect natural, living systems. They have shared their message at the Los Angeles County Arboretum, The Huntington Gardens, The Davis Village Homes, and Aquarium of the Pacific, Tree People. They currently collaborate with Pasadena Water and Power in regenerative design, implementation, and community workshops to bring about the changes we all wish to see.

Churchill Polar Bear Adventure: Nov 6, 2022 – Nov 12, 2022 (tentative)

Join us for a spectacular early winter trip wildlife trip to Churchill, Manitoba, Canada to see Polar Bears. If you ever wanted to see Polar Bears close and personal from the safety of our tundra buggy, this is the trip for you. We have designed a special trip where you will spend 3 full days on the tundra buggies viewing polar bears, snowy owls, artic foxes and other wildlife that we may find. (Normal viewing trips only include 2 days of Polar Bear viewing from Tundra Buggies) This is a special itinerary for those that want to see polar bears or are photographers as only a few tours do 3 days of tundra buggy viewing.

It is a small group tour limited to 14 participants. Churchill is on the Hudson Bay. It is well known for its large concentration of polar bears that come in late autumn-early winter waiting for Hudson Bay to freeze over. We are also doing a half-day, road tour looking for other animals in the Churchill area. We will spend a couple of nights on arrival in Winnipeg and do some sightseeing and exploration of the area on our first full day in town.

Cost includes park, admission fees, all excursion fares, round trip air from Winnipeg to Churchill, Canada bus transportation, 6 nights lodging with your own bed, shared room with 3 nights in Churchill and 3 in Winnipeg. breakfasts and one dinner and more. Group Airfare from LA to Winnipeg may be available. International Airfare to Canada is extra.
