## **Learning to Coexist with Backyard Wildlife**

If you live in foothill communities, then perhaps you've seen a raccoon or two, heard the bark of coyotes (which, incidentally, is their form of communication), witnessed squirrels across the yard, and seen and heard other animals.

We see and hear the sounds wildlife, but maybe not give much thought to their safety and necessity to our own existence. That is, we have to coexist.

That's why programs such as the one presented by Dana Stangel of the Teranga Ranch are necessary. We learned Monday night October 25<sup>th</sup> that, for example, we have marsupials – the possum. She carries her young in her pouch. And when frighten, these

marsupials can become motionless, in a "deathlike" state, even to emitting the stench of death. This is their defense mechanism so that would be attackers would leave them be.

Dana advised not using bird feeders as they can attract other animal: coyotes, raccoons, squirrels, other birds, and even bears. And for small pets, especially cats, she suggested creating a catio. Build sturdy enclosures for chickens (a favorite meal for predators).

She said that deer like flowers. They are skittish and will be discourage about sounds and motions. So, to shoo them out of your gardens and flowerbeds, use motion sensors and sound devices.

## Churchill Polar Bear Adventure: Nov 6, 2022 – Nov 12, 2022 (tentative)

Join us for a spectacular early winter trip wildlife trip to Churchill, Manitoba, Canada to see Polar Bears. If you ever wanted to see Polar Bears close and personal from the safety of our tundra buggy, this is the trip for you. We have designed a special trip where you will spend 3 full days on the tundra buggies viewing polar bears, snowy owls, artic foxes and other wildlife that we may find. (Normal viewing trips only include 2 days of Polar Bear viewing from Tundra Buggies) This is a special itinerary for those that want to see polar bears or are photographers as only a few tours do 3 days of tundra buggy viewing.

It is a small group tour limited to 14 participants. Churchill is on the Hudson Bay. It is well known for its large concentration of polar bears that come in late autumn-early winter waiting for Hudson Bay to freeze over. We are also doing a half-day, road tour looking for other animals in the Churchill area. We will spend a couple of nights on arrival in Winnipeg and do some sightseeing and exploration of the area on our first full day in town.

Cost includes park, admission fees, all excursion fares, round trip air from Winnipeg to Churchill, Canada bus transportation, 6 nights lodging with your own bed, shared room with 3 nights in Churchill and 3 in Winnipeg. breakfasts and one dinner and more. Group Airfare from LA to Winnipeg may be available. International Airfare to Canada is extra.
