We will go ashore at Hoona and Icy Straight Point, home of the Tlingit Community. Leader led hikes and saloon explorations in each port. Experience the spectacular grandeur that John Muir encountered in 1879, when he paddled his canoe in the waters of what is now Glacier Bay.
